Joy on the Journey • Philippians 2:1-4 NRSV

This is the fifth message in our fall sermon series on the letter of Paul to the Philippians. If chapter one could be summarized under the theme "joy in suffering," chapter two might be framed as "joy in serving." Is it possible serving could produce joy in us and others because of our service or the service of others?

- 1. When has someone served you that really had a positive impact on you? What did they do? How did they do it? Was it a one-time act or did it continue over an extended period of time?
- 2. Read Phil. 2:1-4. Focus first on verse one. In the NRSV, the first word is "if," but the text could be translated "since" or "as indeed is the case." Give a positive example of each item Paul lifts up in verse one. What is he trying to do through this speaker's technique in the minds and hearts of his readers/listeners?
- 3. There has been some disunity in the church in Philippi. In fact, he names three of the "problem people" later in the letter. If you were in the church, or one of the three problem causers, how would you react to verse two and three? How would you paraphrase his advice? And how as a leader might you help your brothers and sisters put Paul's advice into practice?
- 4. Is verse four simply a restatement of verse three? How are they similar and different? Is Paul saying that we don't matter, that we are worms and everyone else is better than we are? If not, what is he saying?
- 5. I explained verse three in my sermon, and that to "put others ahead of us in line" does not have to reveal weakness of character or identity but rather could reveal strength of character and an extra reservoir of grace in our lives. How do verses 5-11, which we will cover next week, give us a preview of Christ's example of this principle?
- 6. November 5 is Covenant Sunday, when we offer to God as an act of worship our financial pledge for the coming year. How does Phil. 2:1-4 provide you with a positive rationale for your investment in the life and ministries of Christ through MDPC?
