# **SERMON**NOTES

### Joy on the Journey • Philippians 2:5-11 (NRSV)

This is the sixth in our fall sermon series on Paul's Epistle to the Philippians. In chapter two, I said last week that Paul is trying to help the church through a period of disunity by encouraging them to have joy in serving after the example of Jesus. Today, we look at perhaps the most magnificent and profound words ever penned by Paul about Jesus.

You maybe memorized these verses at some point in your life; if you haven't, I would encourage you to focus on them in a way that they become part of your mind, heart, and soul.

- 1. How does our society define and reward greatness? Identify and share a few examples of the leaders we lift up as models of greatness.
- 2. Read Phil. 2:5-11. How does this section of scripture describe Christ's pre-existence, His earthly human existence, and then His post-human existence in these short verses? What characterizes each phase or state?
- 3. How does verse 5 set up the whole hymn/poem? What is Paul advocating here? Who is to be the model for our definition of and imitation of greatness? How can we nurture this attitude practically in our lives?
- 4. In my sermon, I explained that (from verse 5 and the end of verse 7) Jesus was both fully God and fully human. I tried to explain why that matters for our salvation. How would you summarize my attempt to explain Paul's argument?
- 5. In verses 9-11, Paul describes Jesus' post-human existence and how everyone in heaven or earth or under the earth should respond to Him. Is our worship and service to Him as Savior and Lord to be based on fear or on Christ's sacrificial love for us and the world? Why does how we answer that question change how we relate to Jesus now and to others as we share Him with them?
- 6. Have you yet "bent the knee" to Jesus and confessed Him Lord, to the glory of God the Father, like verses 10-11 encourage? If so, when and how? And if not, why not? What is holding you back, do you think? Can one of the staff or lay leaders of MDPC help you in that process? Please reach out to one of us if we can walk beside you as you work through this most critical relationship in your life.
