# SERMONNOTES

# Joy on the Journey • Philippians 4:10-23

This is the eleventh and final of our Fall/Advent Sermon Series this year. In this last part of chapter four of his Letter to the Philippians, Paul suggests in this thank-you-note-section that there is *joy* to be experienced through *giving* and *receiving*. Sounds to me like a very appropriate Christmas theme and thus relevant to ponder at this time. Enjoy the last few verses of what is probably the last thing Paul wrote to a church before his last breath.

- 1. What is/was your family of origin's tradition and practice regarding the giving and receiving of gifts? How, if at all, have you changed this practice in adulthood?
- 2. Read Phil. 4:10-23. What are the various component parts of Paul's thank-you note to his friends and brothers & sisters in Christ at Philippi? How does he specifically thank them? What is he grateful for regarding their service and friendship?
- 3. Verse 13 has been used by the Prosperity Gospel folk to suggest that God just wants you to be healthy and wealthy in this life and the next. Is that a faithful interpretation based on what Paul says right before and after this verse? What, in your mind, does the verse mean? I tried to share a better translation of that verse in my sermon. It is something like, "I can take in stride all things through Christ who infuses His strength in me." How does that paraphrase change things for you and your attempt to walk it out?
- 4. In verse 17, Paul seems to say that *he* did not need their gift, though it was greatly appreciated, but that *they* needed to give it; or, that they will get credit from God for their generosity. Do you believe that? Is Jesus right in Acts 20:35 where Paul says of Him, "In all this I have given you an example that by such work we must support the weak, remembering the words of the Lord Jesus, for He Himself said, 'It is more blessed to give than to receive'"? How might that apply in this season of buying gifts & receiving them?
- 5. How does Phil. 4:22 finish the thread started in Phil. 1:12-13? What is encouraging and profoundly hopeful about Paul's words here?
- 6. Is verse 23 just a throwaway closing phrase, or is Paul suggesting that the gift he offers back to them is Jesus the Christ? How can you and I keep that gift of *the living Christ* as the most important one for us, our families, and our world this Christmas? How will you nurture connecting your spirit with Christ's Spirit this Advent and beyond?
