SERMONNOTES

Sunday, April 14, 2024 Written by Rev. Dr. Alf Halvorson

UnExpected: The Mourning • Matthew 5:4 NRSV

This is the second in our post-Easter sermon series on the Beatitudes from Matthew's Gospel. I hope last week's message gave the context necessary for our further discussions and set the stage for the next several weeks together. What hit you most about the background I gave in the initial message?

- 1. Read Matt. 4:23-25. What was Jesus doing before this great sermon? How did the people respond? Where did they come from? **Note:** Use the map at the back of your bible or google the places to see the locations listed in verse 25. What impresses you because of that research?
- 2. Read Matt. 5:4. How is the second beatitude similar and different from the first?
- 3. What was your family of origin's attitude toward and approach to mourning? Was it celebrated? Frowned upon? Was there a certain time, place, and appropriate expression of grief? Has your attitude and approach stayed the same during your life or has it adapted? If adapted, how? And why? What does it mean that Jesus not only gives us permission to mourn, but also says it is the right path to be on as a human being and as His follower?
- 4. In verse 4 of Matthew 5, Jesus is not talking about those who have mourned and are done with the grieving process. No. He is addressing those who are currently mourning. They are the ones who have this blessing. How does that hit you? On Jesus' authority, in deep sadness we are in God's good hands. How have you personally experienced that care, support, buoying up, and comfort from God? Is it the comfort you expected, or did it come in a different form than you anticipated?
- 5. As a Christian, is it possible that you are part of the comfort that God wants to deliver to one of His precious servants? How might you be there for someone going through grief at this time? They might have experienced the loss of a loved one or perhaps the loss of a dream or goal or innocence or whatever. Pray for names to come to your head and for ways to tangibly support the grieving around you with your heart and hands/feet. Remember, you, at critical times, can be the conduit of God's care.
