SERMONNOTES

UnExpected: The Meek • Matthew 5:5 NRSV

This is the third in our nine-week post-Easter series on the Beatitudes from the Gospel of Matthew. This is the first beatitude that has a reward or outcome—the meek follower of Jesus "will inherit the earth." That is a lofty and desirable outcome for many. I wonder what you think Jesus means by those words.

- 1. In your experience in the world, who generally *inherits the earth* right now? What qualities or attributes do they possess? Are they qualities you admire or despise?
- 2. Read Matt. 5:5. When you hear the word "meek," what immediately comes to mind? List some adjectives or definitions. Do you think Jesus means in Matt. 5:5 what you have described? Why or why not?
- 3. I spent quite a bit of time explaining what the Greek word for *meek* means in this text. I shared three dimensions or angles. How do they flesh out this word for you? What surprised you in my explanations? And what confirmed your suspicions?
- 4. Then I spent some time working through Numbers 12:3, Prov. 16:32, Psalm 37:1-11, Psalm 21, and Matt. 11:28. How does letting "scripture interpret scripture" fill in important gaps in your understanding of this third beatitude?
- 5. If Moses and Solomon and David and especially Jesus affirmed and modeled what meekness is really to be as a follower of God, what extra insights are gained when you ponder their lives?
- 6. I finished my message with three short videos about a Christian public figure who has been in the news recently because of his great golfing prowess. He is the number one ranked golfer in the world, and a Christian who is willing to show vulnerability about his personal fears but also courage regarding his faith and priorities. He shared about how his wife and friends helped him overcome anxiety in 2022 and 2024 and reminded him about important things regarding the cross and his Lord. How might Scotty Scheffler, though far from perfect, be "meek" in the best sense of that term? And how might his witness encourage you to be more public about your anxieties as well as your faith in Christ? And finally, how might your friends in the faith play an important role in your life, especially when you are feeling overwhelmed? Instead of distancing ourselves when things are challenging, maybe we should draw close to those we respect the most so they can buoy us up as only the body of Christ can. And maybe we can be someone who buoys up our friends or family when they find themselves struggling, too.
