SERMONNOTES

Sunday, April 28, 2024 Written by Rev. Dr. Alf Halvorson

UnExpected: The Hungry • Matthew 5:6 NRSV

This is the fourth in our post-Easter sermon series on the Beatitudes of Jesus. It is also Youth Sunday, which is one of my favorite Sundays of the year. Maybe it's because we get to see how God has worked through our programs, mission trips, individual relationships with far-from- perfect-but-available adults, and through the Holy Spirit's mysterious work to draw the next generation to God's grace and purposes. Or maybe it is the chance to hear how baptismal vows of the parents and our congregation have played out in God's providence and love. Or maybe it is just the chance to hear God's word from voices that share it with new eyes and new hearts.

- 1. What do you hope for regarding your children, grandchildren, and for the children of our congregation?
- 2. Dale Bruner says the first four beatitudes are about our *need* before God. Read the fourth beatitude in Matt. 5:6. What *need* does this verse express?
- 3. Hunger and thirst mean literal hunger and thirst; but they also suggest spiritual hunger and spiritual thirst. Read John 4:14 & 6:35 and describe a time when you have been physically and spiritually hungry and thirsty?
- 4. Righteousness is a complex subject in scripture. When it has to do with God, it suggests the holiness, purity, deeds, and trustworthiness of our Creator, Redeemer, and Sustainer. Read Ps. 71:15-19 to get a feel of this idea. Righteousness for us mean right relationships with God, with others, and with ourselves. And in Matthew, it always means moral behavior conforming to God's will "that results in life and it more abundant." When have you sought righteousness in your life and why did you pursue it?
- 5. In our Reformed Tradition, we know that we are not saved by our works; that righteousness is *imputed* to us as we have faith in Christ. Read Gen. 15:1-6, Rom. 4:1-5; Eph. 2:8-9; I Peter 3:18a; and 1 John 2:1. What do these verses teach you about how righteousness can be received by us? And then how can righteousness be passed on by us in our lives and relationships?
- 6. Read Matt. 6:25-33. How does striving "first for God's kingdom and righteousness" put everything in its proper place as opposed to seeking for what we will eat or drink or wear first? How are you doing with that prioritization? What might need to change so that you hunger and thirst for God first this week?






