Who's in Charge Here? • Esther 2:1-18

This is the second in our six week fall sermon series on the Book of Esther. It was great to have Dave Peterson back last week, with his reminder that we are in a love story, a forgiveness story, and a generosity story because of God's mercy and grace. How does that play out in the story of Esther, where these people of God remain in exile as a fragile minority in a brutal and, at times, evil majority culture that believes and behaves differently from God's will? Covering both chapters 2 & 3 this week is optimistic and probably unrealistic, but I have confidence in your ability to process a lot of material as we move the story forward and ponder how to be faithful in our own time - a time that can be incredibly challenging and dark, too.

- 1. When has life turned out not the way you had planned? When have you found yourself without much power but up against real evil? Where have you been tempted to hide or compromise your faith and identity to survive or bide your time until the right time to act?
- 2. Read Esther 2:1-18. What do the words "gathered" and "carried away" and "taken" suggest in verses 3, 6, 8, and 16? Were Esther and Mordecai in charge? Where were they not in charge? And yet, each takes some initiative and uses agency to reveal their character and faith. What do these exiles do in their tough situation? How might it inspire you in yours?
- 3. Why do you think Mordecai told/commanded Esther not to reveal her people or kindred (or that she was Jewish) in verses 10 and 20? However, why is Mordecai revealed as a Jew in verse 5? Were they the right decisions or the wrong ones?
- 4. Read Esther 2:19-23. What does this short passage, which bridges us to chapter 3, reveal about the Persian Empire and Mordecai/Esther?
- 5. Read Esther chapter 3. The main villain of the story, Haman, is introduced and promoted to second in command in the Persian empire by King Ahasuerus. Why do Haman and Mordecai butt heads? Read Ex. 17:8-16; Num. 24:7, 20; Deut. 25:17-19; and 1 Sam. 15:1-9, 10-33. What is the context that reveals a long-standing hatred between these two people groups? What does Haman propose to the king and how does he cunningly deceive the king into approving an edict of destruction?
- 6. What did I propose in my sermon is the difference between the empires of this world and the kingdom of God? How does the empire operate? What does the empire require? What does God's kingdom provide as an alternative? Have you chosen which kingdom you will serve? How might that play out with decisions/ choices this coming month?
