Don't Treat Soil (or God) Like Dirt • Luke 8:8, 15 & 2 Cor. 1:3-7

This is the second in our short two-week Generosity Series, culminating in each of our pledges for 2025 as an act of worship on Nov 3. That can be done in person or online at pledge.mdpc.org. Last week we focused especially on the third kind of soil where Jesus said that "as for what fell among thorns, these are the ones who hear, but as they go on their way, they are choked by the cares and riches and pleasure of life, and their fruit does not mature." For many of us, we can get stuck or plateau in our faith and life if we don't get our hearts invested correctly. Other things can take the place of God or choke out the work God wants to do in us and through us. That is why, even if we had no needs as a church, we would need to have a Generosity Campaign each year to wrestle with the money issue and make sure it and the pleasures associated with it don't become idols in our lives.

1. Read Luke 8:8 and 15. How does Jesus talk about the good soil? From verse 8, what is its yield? Why do you think it is so productive or fruit-filled? And from verse 15, what are the attributes described about the soil (or the good/beautiful heart) that produces this kind of crop? For instance, what would "hold it fast" and "patient endurance" look like in your mind? Do you personally possess those qualities or attitudes? How might they be nurtured in your life?

- 2. Read 2 Cor. 1:3-7. In my sermon, I defined three words using the Greek: *mercies*, *affliction*, and *consolation*. *Mercies* equals "specific acts of kindness;" *affliction* is "intense pressure;" and *consolation* is "coming alongside." Where have you experienced this kind of pressure? How has God (and God's people) come alongside you? And what specific acts of kindness have you received as a gift from the trinity and the body of Christ?
- 3. Because you and I have been blessed in many cases beyond our own imagination, how might we be blessings to others, MDPC, and the wider world? What percentage of our income is God inviting us to pledge so that people under intense pressure might know God's presence, Christ's love, and the Spirit's support? Can you think of specific acts of kindness that will result from your giving? Pray that your life and others lives might be transformed because of the generosity unleashed through the ministries and outreach of MDPC.
