

### Second Sunday of Advent, Dec 8, 2024 Written by Rev. Dr. Alf Halvorson

# **SERMON**NOTES

## An Artful Advent: The Journeys • Luke 1:39-45; 2:1-5 NRSV

This is the second in our series leading up and through Christmas using art to tell the Story of *Immanuel*, *God with us*. This week, we look at texts where first Mary travels and then Mary and Joseph travel. Mary takes her journey to be with Elizabeth, who the Angel Gabriel said was pregnant, even in Elizabeth's old age and even after years of barrenness. Mary and Joseph take the second journey because the Emperor Augustus required mandatory registration for tax and military-service purposes. And while one trip was voluntary and the other compulsory, God used both to confirm the Good News and get the primary actors to the place where prophecy said the birth of the Messiah would occur. But it is difficult and not without challenges.

- 1. Do you enjoy or try to avoid travel? Can you describe a favorite destination? What has made it special to you?
- 2. Each journey took several daunting days, the second one when Mary was nine months pregnant. I talked in my message about the difference between traveling and touring. How does travel that includes travail result in much more transformation than just being a tourist somewhere in comfortable conditions?
- 3. Read Luke 1:39-45 & 2:1-5. In the first passage, what does Mary learn from Elizabeth? What does Elizabeth learn from the Holy Spirit about Mary and the baby? Why would those gleanings profoundly encourage each woman? In what ways do they support each other?
- 4. In the second passage, Luke 2:1-5, how is it contrasted from the first passage? To me, the first passage is very spiritual; the second is very governmental, procedural, and power-driven. But why was it important for the holy couple to get to Bethlehem? Read Micah 5:2-5. And, if you have been doing Clay's Class, why is Jesus being in the line of David so crucial?
- 5. Jesus said His disciples would "take up their crosses and follow Him." Where might you need to leave something behind this Advent? Where might you need to take on some physical or spiritual journey to put you in a place of dependence on God and receptivity to the birth of the Savior? What would an investment in your faith look like this year? And who might be your traveling companion(s) so that support, encouragement, and critical insights might be shared and received?


