Fourth Sunday of Advent, Dec 22, 2024 Written by Rev. Dr. Alf Halvorson

SERMONNOTES

An Artful Advent: The Celebration • Luke 2:8-15 NRSV

This is the fourth in our Advent Series on The Christmas Story through the lens of art. We are getting closer and closer to the baby, but first, the announcement is made not to the powerful of the land, and not to Caesar Augustus or Quirinius the Governor of Syria. And further, the Message is given not in the palace or the temple, but by angels in a field to shepherds at night. It is a shocking way to share the Good news of God with us in human flesh.

- 1. What was the best celebration you've ever been a part of in your life? Who or what was it for? What made it so special?
- 2. Read Luke 2:8-15. Where is this celebration held? Who are the recipients of this Good News? From what I said in my message, what makes this place and these individuals so surprising, special, and significant?
- 3. Verses 10 & 11 contain some of the most important, amazing, and powerful words ever shared by a messenger of God to humanity. Sit with those two verses for a while; ponder the words and that they are given not just to the world in general but to you (in particular.) If the shepherds, as I shared about in my message, were included, so are you.
- 4. From verse 11, what might you need "saving from"? And what might you need "saving for"? After all, verse 14 suggests that the coming of the Messiah is to bring peace; that is, shalom, wholeness in body and spirit with God and others. How might you live in that peace and share it this Christmas and into the new year?
- 5. The celebration completes the gift. And it spurs action from the celebrants. What do the shepherds do in verse 15, in response to all that had occurred to them in the previous seven verses? John Calvin wrote, "To walk in the Word of God is never to cease to be amazed." The shepherds respond to the Word of God through the angel by "going and seeing" and then "returning glorifying and praising God." How can you put the Good News directed to you this Christmas into practice in your life and work and world like the shepherds did long ago?
