

# All Things New: New Eyes • 2 Kings 6:8-23 NRSV

This is the first in our six-week Winter Sermon Series on the newness we can find in Christ. New Year/New You can sound trite, but in 2 Cor. 5:17, Paul writes, "So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!" What new things can we live into because we are apprentices of Jesus our Savior and Lord?

- 1. Did you take on goals or new resolutions for 2025? Google says that the second Friday of January is "quit day," because so many people give up their New Yea'rs Resolutions so quickly. What part of your life do you wish could become new or different or changed for the positive?
- 2. Read 2 Kings 6:8-15. What is the problem that Elisha and his attendant face? What would you tend to do in that situation? In my sermon, I tried to suggest that we all find ourselves in Dothan sometimes, surrounded by enemies. When was a time you were in a difficult situation like that in your life? What did you do? How did you somehow emerge in tact?
- 3. Read 2 Kings 6:16-17. What does Elisha tell the attendant to do in verse 16? If you were the attendant, what would you think of Elisha's advice? After all, there were just the two of them, with maybe a few non-soldier townspeople against the horses, chariots, and army of the King of Aram. They were outnumbered, outgunned, and Elisha seemed out of his mind. But then verse 17 happens. What did Elisha do? And how did Elisha's prayer change everything? What does the attendant see with his own eyes? What do we need to be reminded of from these two verses when we are seemingly surrounded and without hope?
- 4. Read 2 Kings 6:18-23. How does Elisha, with God's help, resolve this conflict? Why not have the enemies killed? How might Romans 12:14-21 further enlighten our text and our approach to similar situations? Where might we be challenged to take a "healing" tack with our enemies?
- 5. I shared examples from Scripture and told stories where God is not only our Creator but our Deliverer. Share your own stories of God's deliverance in your life. How can you see differently going forward, and live out what vs. 16 admonishes, "Do not be afraid, for there are more with us that there are with them"?
