

All Things New: A New Identity • 2 Timothy 1:7-12

This is the third in our six-week series in the new year about becoming new in Christ. Perhaps these sermons are cumulative or even sequential. If we begin to see with "new eyes" as did Elisha and his attendant, and if we receive our new identity in 1 Peter 2:4-10 through our baptism and profession of faith, then we are invited/challenged to see in 2 Timothy 1:7-12 that God has not given us a spirit of cowardice, but rather a spirit of power and of love and of self-discipline.

- 1. When were you scared and chickened out from some courageous act? And when have you been frightened, but still did the hard, the right, or the courageous thing? Share stories.
- 2. Read 2 Tim. 1:7-12. What does mentor Paul share with mentee Timothy to inspire him? What is Timothy supposed to rekindle from verse 6? Where is he supposed to rely from verse 8? And what is Paul able to say he knows and is sure of from verse 12?
- 3. I talked in my sermon from the very famous story of David confronting Goliath in 1 Samuel 17:20-51. Read that section of Scripture and answer these questions: What offended David to rile him up to be courageous? What previous experiences when David was a shepherd prepared him for this encounter with this enemy of God's people? Do you feel like you are in a hidden phase of life preparing for what is to come, or are you in a very public and very pressure-packed part where nearly every move you make is visible to others? If you are in the former phase, how can you appreciate that your faithfulness here will prepare you for faithfulness needed in the future? And if you are in the latter phase, how can you draw from God's help and the successes of the past in your current battle?
- 4. What things require your courage and faith right now? Perhaps memorize 2 Timothy 1:7, "For God did not give you a spirit of cowardice, but rather a spirit of power and of love and of self-discipline." With God's help and the support of your community of faith, take the hard but necessary step, make the right move even though it is challenging, offer the difficult sacrifice, knowing that "God is able to guard until that day what you have entrusted to Him."
