SERMONNOTES

All Things New: A New Challenge • John 10:1-11 & Acts 2:42-47

This is the fifth in our six-week series in the new year about becoming new in Christ. You may have heard the old saying, "God loves us too much to leave us unchanged." This week we will be discussing "A New Challenge" that God gives us in our ongoing transformation of becoming more like Him. Our first steps are to be grounded in our understanding of Christ's role as our Good Shepherd. Once the nature of that relationship is firmly established in our minds and hearts, then we are ready to pray and grow in our becoming a healthier church community.

- 1. Read John 10:1-2. Who do you think is considered a "thief or a robber" in these verses? Do these types nurture their flocks with good intentions? Who is the true Shepherd? Who are the sheep?
- 2. Read John 10:3-4. What are three things that the Good Shepherd does for His sheep? How important is it to you that the Shepherd knows your name and calls you by name?
- 3. Now read John 10:5-11. How are the true sheep to know who to follow? How do sheep typically react to strangers? How can we know the difference between God's voice and the false voices in the world?
- 4. What does it mean when Jesus describes Himself as the "gate" of the sheepfold? What does this mean in context of spiritual salvation?
- 5. Take a look at Acts 2:42-47. You can clearly see how the disciples of Jesus devoted themselves both to learning from the apostles and also to taking care of one another. What would you say was the central focus of all that was happening in this new church?
- 6. From these verses in Acts, do you see things that could indicate healthiness in a local church? What are those things? What are some upsides of having community? What are some of the risks?
- 7. What was the mindset of the early church? How might we obtain more of that kind of mindset?
