# **SERMON**NOTES

## Words of Woe • Matthew 23:37-39

T his is the seventh and final message in our Lenten Series on Matthew 23. This summary by Jesus includes some of the most poignant and sad words ever spoken in our world. They reflect the love of God for humanity, and humanity's indifference and at times outright rejection of God's plea of support and salvation.

- 1. Have you ever offered love and had that vulnerable and risky move rejected? Or have you ever been on the receiving end of an offer of love, and turned it down?
- 2. Read Matthew 23:37-39. How is verse 37 alike and different from Luke 10:38-42 and Acts 9:1-9?
- 3. In verse 38, Jesus describes the punishment for rejecting God's help as desolation. How is a life apart from God a "desolate" one? How is a life apart from God an "easier" one? How is a life with God a "more meaningful and purposeful" one?
- 4. In verse 39, Jesus seems to be describing when He will return in glory at the end of days. He quotes Ps. 118. If you have time, read the whole psalm. If not, just read vss. 22-26. This is a victory psalm, a Messianic psalm. What do you think Jesus is saying about Himself? What is He saying to the scribes and Pharisees?
- 5. And verse 39 must also have a present application for those listening to what Jesus is saying and for us today. What do you think that invitation is, that challenge is, that application is? I talked in my message about some examples of repentance and some of rejection. Where might you need to repent right now?
- 6. Looking back on the whole "Words of Woe" series from Matthew 23, what is the takeaway God might want for you at this time? For our Church? For the wider world? How can you avoid the fate of the scribes and Pharisees and take the alternative path of those who have said "yes" to Jesus as Savior and Lord? Pray together as we enter Holy Week.
