Sermon Notes

Ruth 4 | Written by Rev. Dr. Alf Halvorson

This is the fourth, and final, in our short fall series on the Book of Ruth. At first glance, the book is about people in such a different time and place that there can't really be any overlap with our own time and place. However, one thing the book reveals is how God is involved in our ordinary lives, and how we might choose to partner with Him to make a difference in the lives and community around us. And all this takes place in the midst of a broken world, where tragedy and pain and suffering and uncertainty are common.

- 1. When have you tried to "get off the hook" regarding some responsibility that was thrust upon you or offered to you? Were you successful in avoiding the challenge? What happened positively or negatively because of your choice? And did anyone fill the gap or take up the slack you left? What happened to them because they addressed the challenge you avoided?
- 2. Read Ruth chapter 4. Where the New Revised Standard Version uses the phrase "next of kin," other translations use "the redeemer" or "family redeemer" or "guardian-redeemer" (ESV, NLT, NIV). That person is the nearest male relative (brother, uncle, cousin) who was called to step in and purchase the land (or buy it back from an outsider) to keep his relative's property from coming under the ownership of someone outside their tribe. Or, based on levirate law, if a man died without an heir, his brother or closest relative was required to marry and be open to procreation with his new wife so the son born from this union would carry forward the line of the deceased. How do you react to this custom and why do you think the first person opts out of the obligation and Boaz accepts the responsibility?
- 3. In verses, 11-16, what do the townspeople *pray for* regarding Boaz and Ruth and Naomi? And what positive results occur? Who might you pray for today?
- 4. Why do you think the names in verses 12 and 18-21 are mentioned? I offered my thoughts on this matter in my message. Does it encourage you or discourage you that there are some skeletons in Ruth and Boaz's family closet? And what about the fact that God always uses *imperfect vessels* to advance His perfect will?
- 5. If Boaz, by his actions as guardian-redeemer, foreshadows what Jesus does as Redeemer for the whole world, how can we appreciate and enter into the benefits made possible by Christ's life, death, and resurrection? What is your biggest takeaway from the Book of Ruth? What are you challenged to think or believe or do differently because of this short series?
