Sermon Notes

2 Corinthians 1:23-2:11 NRSV | Written by Rev. Dr. Alf Halvorson

This is the third in our fall series on 2nd Corinthians. Paul tried to repair the strained relationship he had with the church in Corinth. The Corinthian Christians gave their founding pastor, Paul, more trouble than all his other churches put together. No sooner did Paul get one problem straightened out than three more appeared. He sailed over from Ephesus to confront these issues, then wrote a severe letter, but it didn't seem to have any positive effect but only made things worse. And so, the words from our passage today attempt to work through this challenging situation.

- 1. Why do you think you have easy friendships with certain people/groups, while other relationships seem to take a great amount of work and are characterized by conflict?
- 2. Read 2 Cor. 1:23-2:11. Paul uses the word *pain* or *pained* eight times in the first eight verses of chapter 2. The Greek word literally means "severe mental or emotional distress; vex, irritate, offend, insult." What is your guess of how they "pained" each other from these verses? Can you relate to similar irritations in your own life right now? What vexes you about other people and situations?
- 3. What is Paul's strategy of overcoming the pain? What does he do or not do? What does he suggest and not suggest?
- 4. In verses 5-11, Paul talks about a specific person he had tried to discipline because of some obvious impropriety, who the people at Corinth at first defended, but then disciplined him themselves in the end. What does Paul want done with him now? Why does he suggest that the repentant person be shown grace, forgiveness, and love?
- 5. Is there a person in your life who is difficult to love? How have you tried to fix the relationship in the past? Were they repentant? Does that matter? What from Paul's words or my sermon might help you be a better friend, help restore a broken relationship, or enable someone to move forward with grace and mercy?
- 6. Prov. 27:6, 2 Cor. 7:8-13a, and Luke 24:36-48 call us to a challenging and different way than our society usually suggests regarding how we relate to others (especially those who are difficult to get along with). What takeaway or next step might you attempt in your challenging relationship, because of the presence of Jesus Christ (2 Cor. 2:10)?
