Sermon Notes

2 Corinthians 8:1-15 NRSV | Written by Rev. Dr. Alf Halvorson

This is the fourth message in our longer fall sermon series on Paul's second letter to the church in Corinth. For the next two weeks, we have jumped ahead to chapters 8 and 9 to cover what Paul says about the money he is collecting for the Mother Church in Jerusalem, which is suffering from poverty due to famine and persecution. Sometimes people ask me if there is anywhere in Scripture that talks about pledging and tithing. There are several places, but 2 Corinthians 8 and 9 convey those concepts very clearly and well.

- 1. Growing up, what did you learn about money and giving from your family of origin? Were they worried about money and there not being enough? Or was money plentiful? Was helping others through sharing something that was discussed and lived out, or were you taught by word and deed something different?
- 2. Read 2 Corinthians 8:1–15, focusing on verses 1–6. What does Paul have to say about the churches in Macedonia (northern Greece)? Why do you think Paul contrasts them with the church in Corinth?
- 3. In verses 7–11, Paul challenges the Corinthians to give generously for at least three reasons: one is about excelling, one is about their Savior, and one is about fulfilling promises they have made. Which one do you think would have been most convincing to them? Which one is most convincing to you?
- 4. In verses 12-15, Paul talks about not putting all the weight of giving on them alone while releasing others, but rather about a fair balance and equality in the total effort. In other words, he suggests that they are all in this together—rich and poor, near and far—supporting the needy mother church in Jerusalem. How does tithing or proportional giving (2%, 4%, 10%) of disposable income or assets help us live out that vision?
- 5. I shared about Rich and Nancy Kinder's plan to give away 95% of their fortune, and about an experience from Katharine Hepburn's childhood that shaped her philosophy of giving. How do those examples, in addition to 2 Corinthians 8:1-15, inform, challenge, or inspire your philosophy regarding giving, pledging, and stewardship of time, talent, and treasure? If MDPC is your church home, when you receive your generosity packet in the mail this week—or pick one up at the church—please prayerfully consider how God is calling you to respond this fall for the coming year.
