Sermon Notes

2 Corinthians 4:1-15 NRSV | Written by Rev. Dr. Alf Halvorson

This is the 8th in our fall series on Paul's second letter to the Corinthians. Last Sunday, Paul encouraged the congregation to have confidence and boldness because of what had happened in the new covenant through Christ's blood. The veil is lifted, and we do not need to approach the world with masks/armor/facades. This week, he suggests that, even though they still are under heavy pressure and undergoing real hardship because of persecution and internal conflict, they do not need to *lose heart*. The treasure, Jesus and His Gospel, is right in the middle of their mess to provide life and light in the darkness around them and in them.

- 1. When have you felt that the darkness had closed in on you or your situation? When have people lied about you or your actions? When have plans not advanced as you had hoped, even though you put in all the necessary effort?
- 2. Read 2 Cor. 4:1-15 and focus first on verses 1-6. What were the obstacles against Paul that he counters in verse 2? And how do you react to his contention in verses 3-5 that the ruler of this world (Satan) is part of the reason people have not come to faith? How does the light overcome the darkness of evil?
- 3. In verses 7- 10, Paul says we have a treasure in our broken earthly bodies as believers that helps us overcome and persevere. What is the treasure? Christ? The Gospel? Both? Something else too? Have you felt that power in your life before? Share with others.
- 4. In verses 11-12, Paul contends that somehow allowing death to happen in us allows the life of Christ to manifest itself in us—and for others, too. What do you think he is saying? And have you seen that happen in our world?
- 5. Finally, verses 13-15 suggest that any suffering we endure is overcome in the end with resurrection, thanksgiving, and the glory of God. Does Paul's argument seem "pie in the sky" or does it have teeth and give you real hope in the midst of your real challenges? How does the hope of resurrection at the end of your life shape your attitude and actions in the middle of your life?
