

Directions

From Interstate 10 (Katy Freeway):

Take the Echo Lane/Blalock exit. Go south on Echo Lane until it ends at Taylorcrest and turn right. Take the first left onto Blalock and continue past two stop signs. Turn right into the church parking lot at Entrance 2. If you are traveling to the Sanctuary, park in Lot A (if this lot is full, additional parking may be found in Lots B-E, directly West of Lot A). Lot A is the main parking area.

From Westheimer:

Go north from Westheimer on Fondren. The road becomes S. Piney Point and ends at Memorial Drive. Cross over Memorial Drive and continue past the church to Entrance 2.

General Information

Service Venue Options

The Sanctuary seats up to 1,200 people. It works equally well for 350 or more. The Chapel comfortably seats up to 240 people.

Arrival and Parking

Guest parking is in all lettered Parking Lots (A-G). For guests, Parking Lot A will be the largest and most convenient. Signs directing guests to parking and to the service will be set up throughout the church campus.

Family and special speakers should arrive at least 45 minutes before the service is scheduled to begin.

- **Sanctuary service:** Parking for the family will be reserved in the half-circle off Blalock Road (Entrance 1). Family members, speakers, and guests to be seated with the family should go directly to the Sanctuary Bride's Room.
- **Chapel service:** Family and guests should use Parking Lot A near Blalock. Family members, speakers, and guests to be seated with the family should go directly to the Parlor upon arrival.

Flowers and Mementos

MDPC does not provide flowers, but can assist by setting up flowers you provide or receive, as well as personal photos or mementos. Some guidelines:

- Florists must indicate on the delivery paperwork that the flowers were purchased by the family and are intended for the "memorial service."
- Delivery should occur the day *of* the service, not the day before, and must be delivered at least two hours before the service starts.
- Delivery persons should check in at MDPC's Front Office. Delivery vans can park in half-circle drive accessed by Entrance 1 from Blalock Road.

For a memorial service that is followed by an on-site reception, the ushers will carry floral arrangements from the service location to the reception (if necessary). After the reception concludes, facilities staff will dispose of any remaining floral arrangements, unless the family has made other plans.

Arranging for a Pastor

Memorial services are conducted by one of our pastoral staff. The Memorial Ministries Coordinator will help schedule a pastor and musicians.

Ushers

MDPC provides volunteer ushers. Ushers will reserve pews for the family; greet and seat arriving guests; set out and monitor the guest book; provide guests with copies of the memorial service bulletin; and bring floral arrangements and the guest book to the reception (if the reception is held at MDPC).

Memorial Reception

MDPC offers space for a reception following the memorial service.

As a gift to **MDPC Members**, three dozen cookies will be provided, along with coffee, iced tea, and water. The family may provide their guests with more substantial refreshments.

For **Non-members**, the church can assist with planning a reception to follow the memorial service. Several catering options are available:

1. MDPC has an onsite catering company, ECI, that offers a catering menu for the memorial service reception.
2. If your friends or family have volunteered to bring food for the reception, they must contact the Memorial Ministries Coordinator (contact information on first page) for guidelines and instructions. Following the reception, any remaining food will be boxed for the family to take home.
3. You are welcome to use an outside caterer for the reception. However, the caterer must contact the Memorial Ministries Coordinator to receive instructions and guidelines. Please ask the caterer to supply the proper containers for you to take home leftover food.

For a memorial service followed by an on-site reception, the ushers will carry floral arrangements from the service location to the reception (if necessary).

After the reception concludes, MDPC facilities staff will dispose of any remaining floral arrangements, unless the family has made other plans.

Order of Service and Program

A memorial service may include hymns, instrumental and vocal music, Scripture readings, eulogies, meditation, and prayers. The Order of Service sample below is to familiarize you with terminology and typical service structure.

Please note that each pastor has his or her preferred Order of Service, which will be similar to the sample below, but may not match it exactly.

The Memorial Ministries Coordinator will prepare a simple Order of Service printed program for distribution to family and guests at the service.

Prelude

An organist or pianist plays as guests arrive and the family is seated.

Call to Worship and Prayer of Invocation

The pastor begins by calling the congregation to worship and offering a brief prayer.

Time of Remembrance

Individuals may offer eulogies at this point in the service. We suggest no more than three speakers. Each should prepare written comments, and speaking time should be limited to three minutes per contributor.

Reading of Scripture

The pastor or selected family members read Scripture that points to the promise of salvation received through Christ. Often, the readings begin with Old Testament Scripture and end with a New Testament reading. A selection of Scripture passages are provided in the following pages.

Homily/Meditation

The pastor delivers a Meditation to declare the Gospel and address the circumstances of the day.

Pastoral Prayer

The pastor offers a Prayer of Thanksgiving and Intercession. The Lord's Prayer may be recited by the congregation, or sung as a solo.

Benediction

The pastor closes the service by pronouncing the Benediction.

Music

Congregants may sing a hymn or special music may be performed by a soloist.

Postlude

An organist or pianist plays as the family is escorted from the Sanctuary or Chapel and worshipers are dismissed.

Arranging for Music

The Memorial Ministries Coordinator will assist you in making music selections and arrange for the organist, pianist, soloist, and other musicians. There is a \$300 charge per musician.

OLD TESTAMENT

Job 19:23-27

²³O, that my words were written down! O, that they were inscribed in a book!
²⁴O, that with an iron pen and with lead they were engraved on a rock forever!
²⁵For I know that my Redeemer lives, and that at the last He will stand upon the earth; ²⁶and after my skin has been thus destroyed, then in my flesh I shall see God, ²⁷whom I shall see on my side, and my eyes shall behold, and not another. My heart faints within me!

Psalm 23

¹The LORD is my Shepherd; I shall not want. ²He maketh me to lie down in green pastures: He leadeth me beside the still waters. ³He restoreth my soul: He leadeth me in the paths of righteousness for His Name's sake.

⁴Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for Thou art with me; Thy rod and Thy staff they comfort me.

⁵Thou preparest a table before me in the presence of mine enemies: Thou anointest my head with oil; my cup runneth over. ⁶Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life: and I will dwell in the house of the LORD forever.

Psalm 27

¹The LORD is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? The LORD is the stronghold of my life; of whom shall I be afraid? ²When evildoers assail me to devour my flesh, my adversaries and foes, they shall stumble and fall.

³Though an army encamp against me, my heart shall not fear; though war rise up against me, yet I will be confident. ⁴One thing I asked of the LORD, that will I seek after: to live in the house of the LORD all the days of my life, to behold the beauty of the LORD, and to inquire in His temple.

⁵For He will hide me in His shelter in the day of trouble; He will conceal me under the cover of His tent; He will set me high on a rock. ⁶Now my head is lifted up above my enemies all around me, and I will offer in His tent sacrifices with shouts of joy; I will sing and make melody to the LORD.

⁷Hear, O LORD, when I cry aloud, be gracious to me and answer me! ⁸"Come," my heart says, "seek His face!" Your face, LORD, do I seek.

⁹Do not hide Your face from me. Do not turn Your servant away in anger, You who have been my help. Do not cast me off, do not forsake me, O God of my salvation! ¹⁰If my father and mother forsake me, the LORD will take me up.

¹¹Teach me Your way, O LORD, and lead me on a level path because of my enemies. ¹²Do not give me up to the will of my adversaries, for false witnesses have

risen against me, and they are breathing out violence. ¹³I believe that I shall see the goodness of the LORD in the land of the living. ¹⁴Wait for the LORD; be strong, and let your heart take courage; wait for the LORD!

Psalm 28:6-7

⁶Blessed be the LORD, for He has heard the sound of my pleadings. ⁷The LORD is my strength and my shield; in Him my heart trusts; so I am helped, and my heart exults, and with my song, I give thanks to Him.

Psalm 65:1-8

¹Praise is due to You, O God, in Zion; and to You shall vows be performed, ²O You who answer prayer! To You all flesh shall come. ³When deeds of iniquity overwhelm us, You forgive our transgressions. ⁴Happy are those whom You choose and bring near to live in Your courts. We shall be satisfied with the goodness of Your house, Your holy temple.

⁵By awesome deeds, You answer us with deliverance, O God of our salvation; You are the hope of all the ends of the earth and of the farthest seas. ⁶By Your strength, You established the mountains; You are girded with might. ⁷You silence the roaring of the seas, the roaring of their waves, the tumult of the peoples.

⁸Those who live at earth's farthest bounds are awed by Your signs; You make the gateways of the morning and the evening shout for joy."

Psalm 90

¹Lord, You have been our dwelling place in all generations. ²Before the mountains were brought forth, or ever You had formed the earth and the world, from everlasting to everlasting, You are God. ³You turn us back to dust, and say, "Turn back, you mortals." ⁴For a thousand years in Your sight are like yesterday when it is past, or like a watch in the night.

⁵You sweep them away; they are like a dream, like grass that is renewed in the morning; ⁶in the morning it flourishes and is renewed; in the evening it fades and withers. ⁷For we are consumed by Your anger; by Your wrath we are overwhelmed. ⁸You have set our iniquities before You, our secret sins in the light of Your countenance.

⁹For all our days pass away under Your wrath; our years come to an end like a sigh. ¹⁰The days of our life are seventy years, or perhaps eighty, if we are strong; even then their span is only toil and trouble; they are soon gone, and we fly away.

¹¹Who considers the power of Your anger? Your wrath is as great as the fear that is due You. ¹²So, teach us to count our days, that we may gain a wise heart.

¹³Turn, O LORD! How long? Have compassion on Your servants! ¹⁴Satisfy us in the morning with Your steadfast love, so that we may rejoice and be glad all our days. ¹⁵Make us glad as many days as You have afflicted us, and as many years as we have seen evil. ¹⁶Let Your work be manifest to Your servants, and Your glori-

ous power to their children. ¹⁷Let the favor of the Lord our God be upon us, and prosper for us the work of our hands. O, prosper the work of our hands!

Psalm 103:13-19

¹³As a father has compassion for his children, so the LORD has compassion for those who fear Him. ¹⁴For He knows how we were made; He remembers that we are dust. ¹⁵As for mortals, their days are like grass; they flourish like a flower of the field; ¹⁶for the wind passes over it, and it is gone, and its place knows it no more. ¹⁷But the steadfast love of the LORD is from everlasting to everlasting on those who fear Him, and His righteousness to children's children, ¹⁸to those who keep His covenant and remember to do His commandments. ¹⁹The LORD has established His throne in the heavens, and His Kingdom rules over all.

Psalm 116:1-15

¹I love the LORD, because He has heard my voice and my supplications. ²Because He inclined His ear to me, therefore I will call on Him as long as I live. ³The snares of death encompassed me; the pangs of Sheol laid hold on me; I suffered distress and anguish. ⁴Then I called on the Name of the LORD: "O LORD, I pray, save my life!"

⁵Gracious is the LORD, and righteous; our God is merciful. ⁶The LORD protects the simple; when I was brought low, He saved me. ⁷Return, O my soul, to your rest, for the LORD has dealt bountifully with you.

⁸For You have delivered my soul from death, my eyes from tears, my feet from stumbling. ⁹I walk before the LORD in the land of the living. ¹⁰I kept my faith, even when I said, "I am greatly afflicted"; ¹¹I said in my consternation, "Everyone is a liar."

¹²What shall I return to the LORD for all His bounty to me? ¹³I will lift up the cup of salvation and call on the Name of the LORD, ¹⁴I will pay my vows to the LORD in the presence of all His people. ¹⁵Precious in the sight of the LORD is the death of His faithful ones.

Psalm 121

¹I lift up my eyes to the hills. From where will my help come? ²My help comes from the LORD, who made heaven and earth.

³He will not let your foot be moved; He who keeps you will not slumber. ⁴He who keeps Israel will neither slumber nor sleep.

⁵The LORD is your keeper; the LORD is your shade at your right hand. ⁶The sun shall not strike you by day, nor the moon by night.

⁷The LORD will keep you from all evil; He will keep your life. ⁸The LORD will keep your going out and your coming in, from this time on, and forevermore.

Psalm 130

¹Out of the depths I cry to You, O LORD. ²Lord, hear my voice! Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications! ³If You, O LORD, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? ⁴But there is forgiveness with You, so that You may be revered.

⁵I wait for the LORD, my soul waits, and in His word I hope; ⁶my soul waits for the Lord more than those who watch for the morning, more than those who watch for the morning. ⁷O Israel, hope in the LORD! For with the LORD there is steadfast love, and with Him is great power to redeem. ⁸It is He who will redeem Israel from all its iniquities.

Psalm 139:1-18; 23-24

¹O LORD, You have searched me and known me. ²You know when I sit down and when I rise up; You discern my thoughts from far away. ³You search out my path and my lying down, and are acquainted with all my ways. ⁴Even before a word is on my tongue, O LORD, You know it completely. ⁵You hem me in, behind and before, and lay Your hand upon me. ⁶Such knowledge is too wonderful for me; it is so high that I cannot attain it.

⁷Where can I go from Your spirit? Or where can I flee from Your presence? ⁸If I ascend to heaven, You are there; if I make my bed in Sheol, You are there. ⁹If I take the wings of the morning and settle at the farthest limits of the sea, ¹⁰even there Your hand shall lead me, and Your right hand shall hold me fast. ¹¹If I say, "Surely the darkness shall cover me, and the light around me become night," ¹²even the darkness is not dark to You; the night is as bright as the day, for darkness is as light to You.

¹³For it was You who formed my inward parts; You knit me together in my mother's womb. ¹⁴I praise You, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made. Wonderful are Your works; that I know very well. ¹⁵My frame was not hidden from You, when I was being made in secret, intricately woven in the depths of the earth. ¹⁶Your eyes beheld my unformed substance. In Your book were written all the days that were formed for me, when none of them as yet existed. ¹⁷How weighty to me are Your thoughts, O God! How vast is the sum of them! ¹⁸I try to count them—they are more than the sand; I come to the end—I am still with You.

²³Search me, O God, and know my heart; test me, and know my thoughts. ²⁴See if there is any wicked way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting.

Proverbs 31:10-12, 25-30 (Ode to a Capable Wife)

¹⁰A capable wife who can find? She is far more precious than jewels. ¹¹The heart of her husband trusts in her, and he will have no lack of gain. ¹²She does him good, and not harm, all the days of her life.

²⁵Strength and dignity are her clothing, and she laughs at the time to come. ²⁶She

opens her mouth with wisdom, and the teaching of kindness is on her tongue. ²⁷She looks well to the ways of her household, and does not eat the bread of idleness. ²⁸Her children rise up and call her happy; her husband, too, and he praises her: ²⁹“Many women have done excellently, but you surpass them all.” ³⁰Charm is deceitful, and beauty is vain, but a woman who fears the LORD is to be praised.

Ecclesiastes 3:1-12

¹For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven: ²a time to be born, and a time to die; ³a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted; a time to kill, and a time to heal; a time to break down, and a time to build up; ⁴a time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time to dance; ⁵a time to throw away stones, and a time to gather stones together; a time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing; ⁶a time to seek, and a time to lose; a time to keep, and a time to throw away; ⁷a time to tear, and a time to sew; a time to keep silence, and a time to speak; ⁸a time to love, and a time to hate; a time for war, and a time for peace. ⁹What gain have the workers from their toil? ¹⁰I have seen the business that God has given to everyone to be busy with. ¹¹He has made everything suitable for its time.

Isaiah 40:27-31

²⁷Why do you say, O Jacob, and speak, O Israel, “My way is hidden from the LORD, and my right is disregarded by my God”? ²⁸Have you not known? Have you not heard? The LORD is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He does not faint or grow weary; His understanding is unsearchable.

²⁹He gives power to the faint, and strengthens the powerless. ³⁰Even youths will faint and be weary, and the young will fall exhausted; ³¹but those who wait for the LORD shall renew their strength, they shall mount up with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint.

Isaiah 43:2-3

²When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire, you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. ³For I am the LORD your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior.

Isaiah 55:3-6a

³Incline your ear, and come to Me; listen, so that you may live. I will make with you an everlasting covenant, My steadfast, sure love for David. ⁴See, I made him a witness to the peoples, a leader and commander for the peoples.

⁵See, you shall call nations that you do not know, and nations that do not know you shall run to you, because of the LORD your God, the Holy One of Israel, for

He has glorified you. ⁶Seek the LORD while He may be found, call upon Him while He is near.

Isaiah 61:1-3

¹The spirit of the Lord GOD is upon me, because the LORD has anointed me; He has sent me to bring good news to the oppressed, to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and release to the prisoners; ²to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor, and the day of vengeance of our God; to comfort all who mourn; ³to provide for those who mourn in Zion to give them a garland instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of mourning, the mantle of praise instead of a faint spirit. They will be called oaks of righteousness, the planting of the LORD, to display His glory.”

Isaiah 65:17-19

¹⁷Behold, I will create new heavens and a new earth. The former things will not be remembered, nor will they come to mind. ¹⁸But be glad and rejoice forever in what I will create, for I will create Jerusalem to be a delight and its people a joy. ¹⁹I will rejoice over Jerusalem and take delight in My people; the sound of weeping and of crying will be heard in it no more.”

Daniel 12:1-3

¹At that time, Michael, the great prince, the protector of your people, shall arise. There shall be a time of anguish, such as has never occurred since nations first came into existence. But, at that time, your people shall be delivered, everyone who is found written in the book. ²Many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake, some to everlasting life, and some to shame and everlasting contempt. ³Those who are wise shall shine like the brightness of the sky, and those who lead many to righteousness, like the stars, forever and ever.

Zechariah 8:3-8

³Thus says the LORD: “I will return to Zion, and will dwell in the midst of Jerusalem; Jerusalem shall be called the faithful city, and the mountain of the LORD of hosts shall be called the holy mountain.” ⁴Thus says the LORD of hosts: “Old men and old women shall again sit in the streets of Jerusalem, each with staff in hand because of their great age. ⁵And the streets of the city shall be full of boys and girls playing in its streets.”

⁶Thus says the LORD of hosts: “Even though it seems impossible to the remnant of this people in these days, should it also seem impossible to Me?” says the LORD of hosts. ⁷Thus says the LORD of hosts: “I will save My people from the east country and from the west country; ⁸and I will bring them to live in Jerusalem. They shall be My people and I will be their God, in faithfulness and in righteousness.”

Jeremiah 29:4-14

⁴Thus says the Lord of hosts, the God of Israel, to all the exiles whom I have sent into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon: ⁵"Build houses and live in them; plant gardens and eat what they produce. ⁶Take wives and have sons and daughters; take wives for your sons, and give your daughters in marriage, that they may bear sons and daughters; multiply there, and do not decrease. ⁷But seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the Lord on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare."

⁸For thus says the Lord of hosts, the God of Israel: "Do not let the prophets and the diviners who are among you deceive you, and do not listen to the dreams that they dream, ⁹for it is a lie that they are prophesying to you in My Name; I did not send them, says the Lord."

¹⁰For thus says the Lord: "Only when Babylon's seventy years are completed will I visit you, and I will fulfill to you My promise and bring you back to this place.

¹¹For surely I know the plans I have for you," says the Lord, "plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. ¹²Then when you call upon Me and come and pray to Me, I will hear you. ¹³When you search for Me, you will find Me; if you seek Me with all your heart, ¹⁴I will let you find Me," says the Lord, "and I will restore your fortunes and gather you from all the nations and all the places where I have driven you," says the Lord, "and I will bring you back to the place from which I sent you into exile."

NEW TESTAMENT

Matthew 5:1-12

¹Now when He saw the crowds, He went up on a mountainside and sat down. His disciples came to Him, ²and He began to teach them saying:

³Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

⁴Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted.

⁵Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth.

⁶Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled.

⁷Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy.

⁸Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God.

⁹Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called sons of God.

¹⁰Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for theirs is the Kingdom of heaven.

¹¹Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you, and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of Me. ¹²Rejoice and be glad, because great is your reward in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you."

Matthew 11:25-30

²⁵At that time Jesus said, "I thank You, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because You have hidden these things from the wise and the intelligent and have revealed them to infants; ²⁶yes, Father, for such was Your gracious will. ²⁷All things have been handed over to Me by My Father; and no one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and anyone to whom the Son chooses to reveal Him.

²⁸"Come to Me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. ²⁹Take My yoke upon you, and learn from Me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. ³⁰For My yoke is easy, and My burden is light."

John 6:37-40

Romans 8 (Selected Verses)

¹⁴For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. ¹⁵For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received a spirit of adoption. When we cry, "Abba! Father!" ¹⁶it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, ¹⁷and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ—if, in fact, we suffer with Him so that we may also be glorified with Him. ¹⁸I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory about to be revealed to us.

²⁸We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to His purpose. ³¹What then are we to say about these things? If God is for us, who is against us?

³⁵Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? ... ³⁷No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us. ³⁸For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, ³⁹nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus, our Lord.

Romans 14:7-9

⁷We do not live to ourselves, and we do not die to ourselves. ⁸If we live, we live to the Lord, and if we die, we die to the Lord; so then, whether we live or whether we die, we are the Lord's. ⁹For to this end, Christ died and lived again, so that He might be Lord of both the dead and the living.

1 Corinthians 13

¹If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels, but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. ²And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. ³If I give away all my possessions, and if I hand over my body so that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing.

⁴Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant ⁵or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; ⁶it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. ⁷It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.

⁸Love never ends. But as for prophecies, they will come to an end; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will come to an end. ⁹For we know only in part, and we prophesy only in part; ¹⁰but when the complete comes, the partial will come to an end. ¹¹When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child; when I became an adult, I put an end to childish ways. ¹²For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known. ¹³And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love.

1 Corinthians 15 (Selected Verses)

²⁰But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died. ²¹For since death came through a human being, the resurrection of the dead has also come through a human being; ²²for as all die in Adam, so all will be made alive in Christ.

³⁵But someone will ask, "How are the dead raised? With what kind of body do they come?" ³⁶Fool! What you sow does not come to life unless it dies. ... ³⁸But God gives it a body as He has chosen, and to each kind of seed its own body. ⁴²So it is with the resurrection of the dead. What is sown is perishable, what is raised is imperishable. ⁴³It is sown in dishonor, it is raised in glory. It is sown in weakness, it is raised in power. ⁴⁴It is sown a physical body, it is raised a spiritual body. If there is a physical body, there is also a spiritual body.

⁴⁹Just as we have borne the image of the man of dust, we will also bear the image of the man of heaven. ⁵⁰What I am saying, brothers and sisters, is this: flesh and blood cannot inherit the Kingdom of God, nor does the perishable inherit the imperishable. ... ⁵³For this perishable body must put on imperishability, and this mortal body must put on immortality. ⁵⁴When this perishable body puts on imperishability, and this mortal body puts on immortality, then the saying that is written will be fulfilled: "Death has been swallowed up in victory." ⁵⁵"Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?" ⁵⁶The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. ⁵⁷But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. ⁵⁸Therefore, my beloved, be steadfast, immovable, always excelling in the work of the Lord, because you know that in the Lord, your labor is not in vain.

2 Corinthians 4:16

Therefore we do not lose heart. Though outwardly we are wasting away, yet inwardly we are being renewed day by day.

2 Corinthians 5:1-10

¹Now we know that if the earthly tent we live in is destroyed, we have a building from God, an eternal house in heaven, not built by human hands. ²Meanwhile we groan, longing to be clothed with our heavenly dwelling, ³because when we are clothed, we will not be found naked.

⁴For while we are in this tent, we groan and are burdened, because we do not wish to be unclothed but to be clothed with our heavenly dwelling, so that what is mortal may be swallowed up by life. ⁵Now it is God who has made us for this very purpose and has given us the Spirit as a deposit, guaranteeing what is to come.

⁶Therefore we are always confident and know that as long as we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord. ⁷We live by faith, not by sight. ⁸We are confident, I say, and would prefer to be away from the body and at home with the Lord.

⁹So we make it our goal to please Him, whether we are at home in the body or away from it. ¹⁰For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, that each one may receive what is due him for the things done while in the body, whether good or bad.

Ephesians 3:14-21

¹⁴For this reason, I bow my knees before the Father, ¹⁵from whom every family in heaven and on earth takes its name. ¹⁶I pray that, according to the riches of His glory, He may grant that you may be strengthened in your inner being with power through His Spirit, ¹⁷and that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith, as you are being rooted and grounded in love. ¹⁸I pray that you may have the power to comprehend, with all the saints, what is the breadth and length and height and depth, ¹⁹and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, so that you may be filled with all the fullness of God.

²⁰Now, to Him who, by the power at work within us, is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine, ²¹to Him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Amen.

In Him we were also chosen, having been predestined according to the plan of Him who works out everything in conformity with the purpose of His will.

Ephesians 2:1-10

¹As for you, you were dead in your transgressions and sins, ²in which you used to live when you followed the ways of this world and of the ruler of the kingdom of the air, the spirit who is now at work in those who are disobedient.

³All of us also lived among them at one time, gratifying the cravings of our sinful nature and following its desires and thoughts. Like the rest, we were by nature objects of wrath. ⁴But because of His great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, ⁵made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in transgressions—it is by grace you have been saved. ⁶And God raised us up with Christ and seated us with Him in the heavenly realms in Christ Jesus, ⁷in order that in the coming ages He might show the incomparable riches of His grace, expressed in His kindness to

us in Christ Jesus.

⁸For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—⁹not by works, so that no one can boast. ¹⁰For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.

Colossians 3:1-4

¹So if you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. ²Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth, ³for you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. ⁴When Christ, who is your life, is revealed, then you also will be revealed, with Him, in glory.

1 Thessalonians 4:13-18

¹³Brothers, we do not want you to be ignorant about those who fall asleep, or to grieve like the rest of men, who have no hope. ¹⁴We believe that Jesus died and rose again and so we believe that God will bring with Jesus those who have fallen asleep in Him.

¹⁵According to the Lord's own word, we tell you that we who are still alive, who are left till the coming of the Lord, will certainly not precede those who have fallen asleep. ¹⁶For the Lord Himself will come down from heaven, with a loud command, with the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet call of God, and the dead in Christ will rise first.

¹⁷After that, we who are still alive and are left will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And so we will be with the Lord forever. ¹⁸Therefore encourage each other with these words.

¹Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles, and let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us. ²Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy set before Him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.

³Consider Him who endured such opposition from sinful men, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart.
