



What is Church in the City?

One of MDPC's Advantage Goals is to serve together in the city one Sunday a year. Outreach is an important part of our life as a church family, and we want to serve our city well for Christ. This will be a day for us to worship God and to serve those whom Christ has called us to serve.

What are the different projects for 2025?

Serve at MDPC:

- · Make sandwiches for Kids' Meals
- Create and assemble items to support our local ministry partners (aka Partner Projects)

Serve Offsite:

- Sort, organize, and pack meals at the **Houston Food Bank** (535 Portwall St, 77029)
- Work to beautify indoor and outdoor areas for women and children and interact with clients at **Santa Maria Hostel** (2605 Parker Rd, 77093) and **Mission of Yahweh** (10247 Algiers Rd, 77041)
- Paint, landscape, and make minor repairs to support children and families at **SpringSpirit**'s two locations (8526 Pittner Rd or 3601 Campbell Rd, 77080; volunteers will each be assigned to one location)
- Assemble on Saturday and, on Sunday, distribute hygiene backpacks to unhoused Houstonians at **Magnificat House** (2009 Congress St, 77002)

Serve at Home:

- Write notes of encouragement to global mission partners
- · Bag beans and rice
- Bag dog and cat treats
- · Socks of Love

What are the age limitations?

Kids' Meals bag decorating in the Summit Room is appropriate for ages 2+ if your child is excited about participating. Children 4+ should register for age-appropriate projects (see project guidelines at **citc.mdpc.org**).

- Sunday, 8:00am-1pm 3 months-3 years old No reservation required
