WIHY GIVE

Why give? I John 4:19, says, "We love because he first loved us." The same is true of generosity. We are generous givers because God has so generously given to us. We give because we have been given to.

When you harvest, God, through Moses, tells the people in Deuteronomy, do not harvest perfectly but leave a little behind for the orphan, widow, and foreigner (Deut. 24:19). In other places in scripture, the tithe, 10%, is presented as the guide for giving. In commanding us to leave some behind for others, there is a promise that, whatever harvest you have, it will, generously, be enough. Enough to share. Generously so!

We give because our neighbor, like the orphan, widow, and foreigner in Deuteronomy, needs us to. When we give, our neighbors benefit. They are fed, nurtured in faith, welcomed, helped. God gives us the vocation of being helpers to one another, blessed to be a blessing. When you give to your church, you are helping your church which, in turn, helps not only you but also others who are touched by Southwood's ministries.

We give because it's good for us. People who give are happier, healthier, more content, and grateful. Being generous and behaving generously not only benefits your neighbor, but it benefits you!

Finally, we give because we cannot help but do so. Abundant life has this way of overflowing and generously leaving a trail behind. The Holy Spirit moves you and God gets you to give and share your life and the gifts of it.
