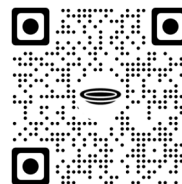

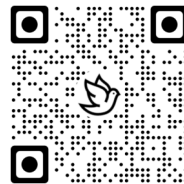

✧ NOTES ABOUT TODAY'S MUSIC ✧

This morning's postlude is an organ setting of an orchestral work by Edward Elgar (1857-1934). The entire work consists of fourteen movements, each a variation of a single, original theme; and each dedicated to a friend of the composer. The *Nimrod* movement, perhaps the most well-known, was dedicated to his publishing friend Augustus Jaeger. In the Old Testament, Nimrod is described as a "mighty hunter before the Lord." *Jaeger* is the German word for "hunter." This selection, with its dramatic musical arc, is often associated with memorial services.
