

In addition to the 50 hours of training to be Stephen Ministers, Ann and Toby received an additional 25 hours of training through the Stephen Ministry Leader's Course. - More than **75,000** pastors and lay leaders from those congregations have been equipped as Stephen Leaders.

- More than **1.5 million** people have had a Stephen Minister to walk with them, providing one-to-one Christian care during tough times.
