



> NOTES ABOUT TODAY'S MUSIC ◆

The text of "Guide Me, O Thou Great Jehovah" is rich with Biblical imagery. The verses all ask for God's leadership—of pilgrims through barren land, by the fire and cloudy pillar, and when we are at our earthly life's end—and each ends with a note of hope. The text was in 1762, and the tune in 1907, both by Welshmen. Arranger Benjamin Harlan is a composer, church musician, and advocate for congregational singing. He served over a dozen churches and on on the faculty two seminaries.
