## >> NOTES ABOUT TODAY'S MUSIC ◆

We conclude our summer music series, Music for Two, with bassoonist Thomas Schneider. After earning degrees from the Oberlin Conservatory and the University of Maryland, and appearing at festivals and orchestras across the country, Thomas joined the Richmond Symphony in the principal bassoon chair.

François Devienne (1759-1803) was a French composer, flutist, and bassoonist. He wrote approximately 300 instrumental works, focusing on wind instruments. This morning's selections are drawn from one his six bassoon sonatas. The sonata consists of three movements, each referred by its tempo marking. In addition to being a charming piece, this sonata highlights the voice of an instrument not often featured in a solo capacity.
