🌀 NOTES ABOUT TODAY'S MUSIC 🌀

This morning's organ music features Johann Krebs, a German composer who lived from 1713 - 1780. Like his father, Krebs was a pupil of J. S. Bach. His performance technique rivaled those of his teacher, and his compositions were equally well-regarded. Unfortunately he rose to prominence as the Baroque era was waning. He was unable to find employment that matched his musical prowess. He never held a royal court composer or major cathedral post, nor was he commissioned to write music for compensation.
