#### > NOTES ABOUT TODAY'S MUSIC ◆

This morning's prelude and postlude are by French organist and composer, Jean Langlais (1907-1991). Langlais was one of a number of prominent blind French organists, having attended the National Institute for Blind Children in Paris after losing his sight to glaucoma at the age of two. It was there that he was introduced to the pipe organ. He went on to the Paris Conservatoire, returned to the Institute to teach, and served as the organist titulaire at Basilica of Sainte-Clotilde in Paris from 1945 until 1988.

Langlais's music is unapologetically modern, while often drawing inspiration from Gregorian chant themes. This morning's prelude is a lush meditative selection, while the postlude features a more angular, fanfare-like melody.
