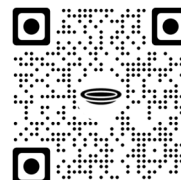
***AFFIRMATION OF FAITH: FROM THE CONFESSION OF 1967, SECTIONS 9:31-33** (Unison)

If you are seated on the main floor of the sanctuary, you are invited to come forward to the chancel area by way of the center aisle and return to your pews by the side aisle. If you are sitting in the balcony, an usher will guide you to the sacrament. If you are unable to come forward easily, please signal to one of the ushers or elders so the communion elements can be brought to your seat.
