

>> NOTES ABOUT TODAY'S MUSIC ◆

Today, we celebrate the Baptism of Jesus. Much of our music relates to that story and images of water, rivers, and springs. Our first two hymns, "Shall We Gather at the River" and "Baptised in Water," make clear references to those themes. Our closing hymn, "Go, My Children, with My Blessing" is similar to the benediction that a pastor might say at the end of a worship service, or perhaps after a baptism. Today's offertory anthem is about Jesus' baptism in the Jordan river and its significance to all of us.

The hymn tune *Beach Spring* first appeared in the tune book *The Sacred Harp,* published in 1844. It has been set to a number of tunes, including no. 490 in our hymnal, "Wash, O God, Our Sons and Daughters." It asks for God's presence with us through baptism.

This morning's postlude is based on the spiritual song "Wade in the Water." There are many interpretations of the text. One interesting possibility comes from the pen of Howard Thurman, Dean of the Chapel at Howard University, who states:

For [the slaves] the 'troubled waters' meant the ups and downs, the vicissitudes of life. Within the context of the 'troubled' waters of life there are healing waters, because God is in the midst of the turmoil ... Do not shrink from moving confidently out into the choppy seas. Wade in the water, because God is troubling the water.
