

# > NOTES ABOUT TODAY'S MUSIC ◆

This morning's organ music is drawn from Edvard Grieg's *Holberg Suite*, a set of five movements based on eighteenth-century dance forms. They were originally written for piano in celebration of the 200th anniversary of a famous Norwegian playwright. Grieg would later adapt them for string orchestra, but they are equally charming on the pipe organ. Throughout his career, Grieg drew inspiration from his native Norwegian folk music. His music is offered today in recognition of Norwegian Independence Day, May 17, by our organist, whose family proudly celebrates their Norwegian heritage.
