



Addressing the first two stanzas to the singers of the hymn and the last three to God, this free paraphrase of Psalm 104 recasts the psalmist's imagery with baroque verve. Though it was first published in England, the tune has been more popular in North America than there.

➢ NOTES ABOUT TODAY'S MUSIC <</p>

"Down by the Riverside" is a spiritual that dates back to before the American Civil War. The song refers to biblical imagery such as baptism (the white robe) and heaven (the starry crown), and the "riverside" is of course the River Jordan. The song is a popular New-Orleans-style jazz standard, and today's arrangement reflects some of that history, particularly in the piano part.

The arranger, John Rutter, has published hundreds of choral compositions, including many Christmas carols. Rutter was knighted by King Charles in June of last year.

Our prelude and postlude are by jazz composer Joe Utterback. They are drawn from a larger suite of music, Hudson River Voluntaries, inspired by scriptural references to rivers. The prelude is based on Psalm 46:4 (There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God, the holy habitation of the Most High), while the postlude is based on Revelation 22:1 (Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life, bright as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb).
