This narrative and interpretive text was written to fill what the author perceived as an unfortunate gap in available hymns concerning the Holy Spirit in general and Pentecost in particular. The setting of a 17th-century German tune is from Mendelssohn's oratorio *Elijah*.



>> NOTES ABOUT TODAY'S MUSIC ◆

"Come Down, O Love Divine," our offertory anthem, focuses on the gift of the Holy Spirit. While we often celebrate this gift to the church, this text is from a personal perspective, and the Spirit's presence results in awed, humble acceptance. This musical setting evokes the mystery of this gift in the first stanza, with dense sonorities and fluttering, bird-like treble lines. After a grand interlude, the second and third verses are on firmer ground.

The anthem's arranger, Todd Wilson, is an organist based in Ohio, and the nephew of WPC member Don Darnton. He was featured on our Open Door Concert Series in 2019.
