This hymn by a 19th-century Scottish pastor is specifically based on Revelation 1:7 and 22:20, with allusions to several other New Testament passages. Unlike medieval hymns that focused on judgment, this text understands the Second Coming as an occasion of triumph and joy.

This unusual dialogue hymn alternates between the voice of a traveler and that of a watchman, setting up an exchange that creates parallels between the coming of dawn and the birth of Christ. The tune is named for a Welsh town whose name means "mouth of the bending river."

>> NOTES ABOUT TODAY'S MUSIC ◆

The music for "O Come, Divine Messiah" comes from a sixteenth-century French Christmas carol originally about the animals in the manger. The words we sing today come from the eighteenth-century abbot Simon-Joseph Pellegrin, translated into English by Sister Mary of St. Philip in 1872. The melody was most famously used by Marc-Antoine Charpentier in his *Messe de minuit pour Noël. a mass for Christmas eve based on French Christmas carols.*

We close this morning's service with J. S. Bach's contemplative setting of *Sleeper's Awake*, a *Voice is Calling*, joining churches worldwide in a tradition of playing this well-known masterpiece at the opening of the Advent season.
