


## **CALL TO WORSHIP**







## >> NOTES ABOUT TODAY'S MUSIC ◆

Today's prelude is an original composition by Craig Courtney. "The Yearning" expresses the universal longing for "the promised one" to bring an end to our sorrows. The music and lyrics gradually build to a dramatic climax, calling out for Emmanuel as we await the day of his appearing.

The Wexford Carol is a retelling of the birth of Jesus. The original text is much longer than our version and narrates the nativity story in detail. Our setting today focuses on the shepherds visiting the baby in the manger, and emphasizes the gratitude and joy we feel at the birth of Jesus. The carol comes to us from the county of Wexford in the northeastern corner of Ireland, and has its roots in the twelfth century. It is probably the oldest and most famous Irish Christmas carol.

The text of "Angels, from the Realms of Glory" gives directions to the angels, shepherds, sages, and all creation to "come and worship Christ, the newborn King." The music was originally composed for a rather lengthy Gloria Patri in the 1866 version of the Presbyterian hymnal by an organist who served a Presbyterian church located at Regent Square in London.
