>> THIS EVENING'S MUSIC ◆

This evening's organ music features the Canonic Variations on *Vom Himmel Hoch*. The English translation of the hymn, entitled "From Heaven Above, To Earth I Come", can be found on page 111 in the pew hymnal. Bach composed a series of five variations of increasing musical complexity. The first variation opens with a descending scale in the right hand, representing Christ's coming among us. The left hand plays the identical musical line throughout the entire piece, slightly delayed, while the melody appears in the pedal line. The second variation is of similar style, with the left hand mirrors the right hand but starting on a different note. By the fifth variation, the melody appears in all voices in a variety of decorations including inverted (upside down). The closing flourish features six independent musical lines wrapping around Bach's signature motif, spelling his name (B-A-C-H) in the last measure. Bach's genius shines in making this mind-bending composition joyful and appropriate for the season. Want to know how to spell B -A-C-H on a keyboard? Or see the various musical lines interweaving?
