





❖ NOTES ABOUT TODAY'S MUSIC ❖

This morning we continue a month-long exploration of organ music from Black composers.

Florence Price (1887-1953) was born in Little Rock, Arkansas and began piano studies at an early age before attending the New England Conservatory of Music. She is the first African-American woman to have a composition performed by a major orchestra. In addition to symphonic works, she composed for a variety of instruments and chamber ensembles, including a notable body of work for the pipe organ. Today's worship service opens and closes with third and fourth movement from her *Suite No. 1 for Organ*. Stay tuned for more music by this remarkable composer later this month!

Our offertory anthem is a setting of Psalm 27, which begins with the words "The Lord is my light and my salvation." It is presented as a traditional chanted Psalm with an antiphon, a sung refrain after each verse. John Behnke is church musician and prolific composer of choral and handbell music from Milwaukee. He served as a professor of music at Concordia College Wisconsin and as music editor for the Handbell Musicians of America.
