

Since its creation in the mid-19th century, this text has been one of the favorite paraphrases of Psalm 23 in the English-speaking world. That popularity increased in the early 20th century when *The English Hymnal*, 1906, first joined these words to this flowing Irish melody.

INVITATION TO THE OBSERVATION OF THE LENTEN DISCIPLINE (responsive)

Leader: Beloved in Christ, at the time of the Christian Passover we celebrate our deliverance from sin and death through the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. Lent is the season of preparation for this great celebration, the means by which we renew our life in the Paschal mystery. We begin our Lenten journey by acknowledging our need for repentance, for in penitence, we name those things which damage us and others for what they really are, and we open ourselves to the One whose love knows no boundaries and whose mercy is demonstrated to us in the life of Jesus Christ. By taking an honest look at our lives and repenting of our foolishness; by praying quietly but with full hearts; by letting go of those things that harm us and by taking on works of love for others; by reading and feasting on God's Word, we observe a holy Lent, and prepare ourselves for the passion of Holy Week and the joy of Easter. Let us prepare ourselves to come to our God.

Before Christ, let us confess our sin, how it is with our life, and our lives together:

PRAYER OF CONFESSION (unison)

Have mercy, O God, have mercy on us. We have many treasures on earth that we hold too dearly; that we withhold from others in need. When we sin against neighbor, condone injustice, and quarrel with one another, we sin against you. Forgive us, we pray, for we are broken in spirit. Do not see us for our faults, and do not go away from us. Keep us always in your presence so that we may be restored to the joy of your salvation. Sustain in us a willing spirit to treasure what you desire; then our hearts will be opened in joy and gladness. In Jesus Christ, our Treasure, we pray. Amen.

KYRIE (responsive)

Leader: Lord, have mercy.

People: **Christ, have mercy.**

All: Lord, have mercy.

LITANY OF PENITENCE (responsive)

Leader: According to God's steadfast love, according to God's abundant mercy, God does not pass judgment on us the judgment we deserve.

All: **God creates in us clean hearts and gives a new and right spirit. In the grace of Jesus Christ, we return to God forgiven. Praise God for our salvation!**

INVITATION TO ASHES

Leader: We will continue our journey to Easter with the sign of ashes. Tonight, you will be marked with ash and in the sign of a cross. You will hear the words from Scripture, "From dust you came. To dust you shall return. Be at peace." This ancient sign and ritual speaks of the frailty and uncertainty of human life, the truth of our impermanence and the need for Christ's love and light.

The sign with which we are marked reveals our desire to live repentant lives, individually and as the gathered beloved community, and our hope in the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

In the name of Christ, we are invited to observe a holy Lent by self-examination and self-emptying love with practices of prayer and fasting; with works of loving kindness and mercy; and by meditating on God's good Word, ancient and new.

PRAYER OVER THE ASHES

Leader: From dust we came, to dust we shall return; and even yet, we sing "Alleluia" at the grave because death is not the end, only a sign of an impending resurrection. May these ashes tonight be for us a sign of our mortality, a desire for repentance, and a reminder that only by your gracious gift are we given everlasting life through Jesus Christ our Savior. Amen.
