

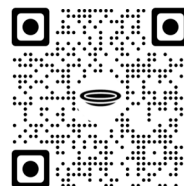

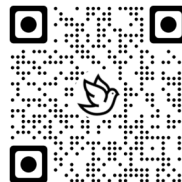

Like many African American spirituals, this one mixes the language of biblical narrative with veiled but effective allusions to the hope of escape from slavery, either by crossing rivers into free states or by participating in organized efforts like the Underground Railroad.

The service of worship concludes after the postlude. The music can be enjoyed or used as an opportunity for prayer. You may remain seated; if you wish to depart, please do so quietly and without disturbing those who choose to stay.

### ∞ TODAY'S MUSIC NOTE ∞

This morning's prelude, offertory, and postlude feature the Pentecost hymn, *Veni Creator Spiritus*. The text, credited to a ninth-century monk, is an appeal for the Holy Spirit to come among us. The melody is a Gregorian Chant from around the year 1000.

Hal Hopson arranged a choral setting which opens with the original chant tune. Listen for Hopson's later use of *tone painting*, depicting the text literally as a "mighty storm".

Our postlude is drawn from the closing movement of Maurice Durufié's masterful organ composition, *Prélude, Adagio et Choral varié sur le thème du Veni Creator*. It features the melody in canon, played independently in the right hand and pedal line before concluding with a grand setting of the closing notes that accompany the 'Amen' in the original plainsong melody.
