The author of this Trinitarian text is unknown, but this hymn has proved popular since the middle of the 18th century, partly because of its effective use of biblical metaphors, but also because of the strength of this tune, which was composed especially for these words.

During their 67-year history, hundreds of boys have been educated in great sacred and classical music and in etiquette and discipline. The choristers range in age from nine to eighteen years old and are drawn from the private and public schools in the Burlington area. Boys are chosen for their musical ability and for their maturity, discipline, and high academic standing. The choir has traveled extensively both at home and abroad, including numerous trips to Europe and four invitations to the White House. They have appeared with the Greensboro and Winston-Salem Symphonies. In 2017 they sang as featured artists with the Eastern Music Festival Orchestra, conducted by Gerard Schwarz.
