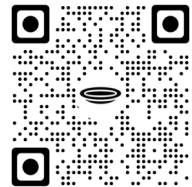
*AFFIRMATION OF FAITH: THE APOSTLES' CREED (unison)

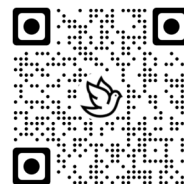

“Dignare, Domine” comes from Karl Heinrich Graun’s grand, eleven-movement *Te Deum*. The piece was composed in 1756 to celebrate a Prussian military victory during the Seven Years’ War. The *Te Deum* is one of Graun’s most well-known works.

Sophie Morris-Suzuki has been a choral scholar in the chancel choir for the past two years. She has sung several solos in worship both alone and with the choir. This summer, she will be singing in a production of *The Magic Flute* with the Lyric Opera Studio in Weimar, Germany. Today is Sophie’s last Sunday at WPC.
