RESPONSIBILITIES OF SERVING AS AN ELDER

Ruling Elders serve on the Session, which is the governing body of a Presbyterian congregation. Their responsibilities include: all aspects of worship, including the sacraments of Baptism and the Lord's Supper; all aspects of education, including Church School and special training; all aspects of mission, including local outreach and international evangelism; all aspects of fellowship and nurture of the spiritual life within the congregation; all aspects of church administration, including buildings, finances, and stewardship. These responsibilities are normally carried out through Ministries assigned to these various needs and tasks.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF SERVING AS A DEACON

Deacons help provide pastoral care for members of the church. In many respects, the Deacons are the "heart and hands" of the church, comforting, supporting and caring for the congregation. In addition, our Deacons strive to create an active and caring church by involving members in various social activities designed to help them to better know and appreciate the church and each other. The Diaconate consists of six ministry teams and six care teams whose work is carried out by deacons and volunteer church members.

LITANY OF SERVICE

Leader: There are different gifts,

People: But it is the same Spirit who gives them.

Leader: There are different ways of serving God, **People:** But it is the same Lord who is served.

Leader: God works through different people in different ways, **People:** But it is the same God who fulfills these purposes

through them all.

People: And individually members of Christ.

INTRODUCTION OF RULING ELDERS AND DEACONS

CONSTITUTIONAL QUESTIONS TO OFFICERS

(After each question, ruling elder and/or deacon will respond I do or I will.)

Do you trust in Jesus Christ your Savior, acknowledge him Lord of all and Head of the Church, and through him believe in one God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit?

Do you accept the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be, by the Holy Spirit, the unique and authoritative witness to Jesus Christ in the Church universal, and God's Word to you?

Do you sincerely receive and adopt the essential tenets of the Reformed faith as expressed in the confessions of our Church as authentic and reliable expositions of what Scripture leads us to believe and do, and will you be instructed and led by those confessions as you lead the people of God?

Will you fulfill your office in obedience to Jesus Christ, under the authority of Scripture, and be continually guided by our confessions?

Will you be governed by our Church's polity, and will you abide by its discipline? Will you be a friend among your colleagues in ministry, working with them, subject to the ordering of God's Word and Spirit?

Will you in your own life seek to follow the Lord Jesus Christ, love your neighbors, and work for the reconciliation of the world?

Do you promise to further the peace, unity, and purity of the Church?

Will you seek to serve the people with energy, intelligence, imagination, and love?

(For Ruling Elders)

Will you be a faithful ruling elder, watching over the people, providing for their worship, nurture, and service? Will you share in government and discipline, serving in governing bodies of the Church, and in your ministry will you try to show the love and justice of Jesus Christ?

(For Deacons)

Will you be a faithful deacon, teaching charity, urging concern, and directing the people's help to the friendless and those in need? In your ministry will you try to show the love and justice of Jesus Christ?

QUESTIONS TO CONGREGATION

Do you the members of the church, accept as ruling elders and deacons, these members chosen by God through the voice of this congregation to lead us in the way of Jesus Christ?

Congregation: We do.

Do you agree to pray for them, encourage them, to respect their decisions, and to follow as they guide us, serving Jesus Christ, who alone is Head of the Church?

Congregation: With God's help, we will serve Christ through this church family.

LAYING ON OF HANDS

All teaching elders and ruling elders are invited to come forward and lay hands on those being ordained as a sign of setting apart and of blessing.

PRAYER OF DEDICATION

Pastor: Almighty God, in every age you have chosen servants to speak your word and lead your loyal people. We thank you for these men and women you have called to serve you. Give them special gifts to do their special work; and fill them with your Holy Spirit, so they may have the same mind that was in Christ Jesus, and be faithful disciples as long as they live. Give them strength, wisdom and love to work for Christ joyfully.

People: God of grace, who called us to a shared ministry as ambassadors of Christ, trusting us with the message of reconciliation: give us courage and discipline to follow where your servants lead us, that together we may declare your wonderful deeds and show your love to the world, through Jesus Christ the Lord of all. Amen.

STATEMENT OF ORDINATION AND INSTALLATION

Pastor: You are now ruling elders and deacons in the Church of Jesus Christ and for this congregation. Whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him. Amen.
