Annette (Moyer) Zak, 78, died peacefully in her home in Williamsburg, VA, on March 14, 2026, surrounded by family. Annette and Paul enjoyed many adventures in the area and also made many new friends. Annette enjoyed using her interior design skills to design their home and her flower arranging skills both at home and as part of the flower guild at Williamsburg Presbyterian Church.

Annette was a lifelong Presbyterian, a follower of Jesus. She devoted much of herself and her time to Bible study groups and personal reading and reflection, and she always looked forward to Sunday services.

Annette is survived by her husband, Paul, daughters, Deborah Zak and Karen Zak, and her brother, William Moyer. She is preceded in death by her parents, Wilmer and Lillian Moyer, her sisters, Judith Moyer and Janette Moyer, and her brother, Michael Moyer.
