☞ NOTES ABOUT TODAY'S MUSIC ☞

Our prelude and postlude are both by eighteenth-century British organists. Matthew Camidge lived from 1758-1844. A *gavotte* is a dance form. Music written for such a dance are often light and rhythmic, a nod to the light-footed dance pattern, with an emphasis on the third beat of every measure. John James died in 1745. An English *voluntary* is a piece of music not based on a known tune. It is to sound “volunteered”, or improvised on the spot.

Thomas Atwood, the composer of “Teach Me, O Lord,” was the organist at St. Paul’s Cathedral in London from 1796 until his death. He played his own organ composition for the funeral of Lord Nelson, and his setting of “I Was Glad” was performed at the coronations of King George IV, King William IV, and Queen Victoria. He is buried under the organ at St. Paul’s.

Our Communion anthem was composed by Terre Johnson, a composer who has written music for many groups, including the St. Olaf Choir, Luther College, and Williamsburg Presbyterian Church. In 2019, we sang his setting of “Of the Father’s Love Begotten,” which he customized for our choir and a woodwind ensemble. Dr. Johnson is the chair of the School of Music at Georgia Southern University, where our music director, Chris Bechtler, taught before he came to WPC.
