What do you read there?" ²⁷ He answered, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbor as yourself." ²⁸ And he said to him, "You have given the right answer; do this, and you will live." ²⁹ But wanting to justify himself, he asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" ³⁰ Jesus replied, "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and fell into the hands of robbers, who stripped him, beat him, and went away, leaving him half dead. ³¹ Now by chance a priest was going down that road; and when he saw him, he passed by on the other side. ³² So likewise a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. ³³ But a Samaritan while traveling came near him; and when he saw him, he was moved with pity. ³⁴ He went to him and bandaged his wounds, having poured oil and wine on them. Then he put him on his own animal, brought him to an inn, and took care of him. ³⁵ The next day he took out two denarii, gave them to the innkeeper, and said, 'Take care of him; and when I come back, I will repay you whatever more you spend.' ³⁶ Which of these three, do you think, was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?" ³⁷ He said, "The one who showed him mercy." Earlier this year, a group was assembled with approval of the Leadership Council to consider how we might address some significant needs and provide enhancements to our church's building, mission and ministry that cannot be met utilizing funds from the annual Operating Budget or the Building Improvement Fund. In collaboration with the Board of Trustees, myself and others developed a list of projects and we are now contemplating a capital campaign to address these needs.

As a next step in this consideration, the church is conducting a feasibility study to help determine our readiness to successfully conduct such a campaign. As a part of this study, we are inviting an intentionally diverse and representative group of persons/families to participate in one-on-one interviews to explore their thoughts about the church's readiness for a capital campaign. 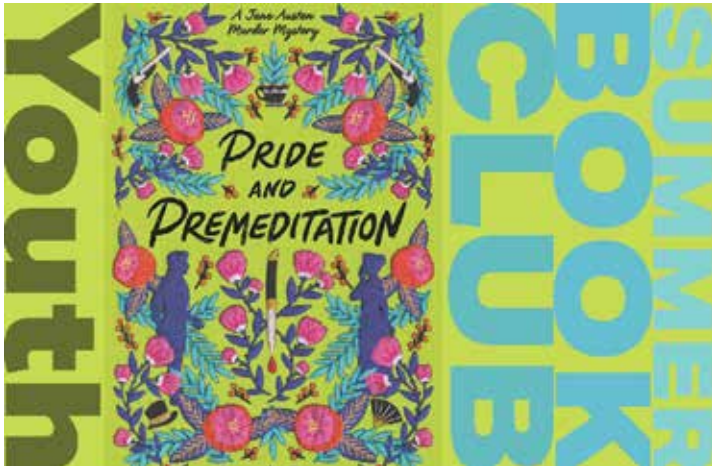
WOW (Women of the Word), Thursday, July 11, 10 a.m. - noon in Room 111 or via Zoom
