Specific Questions: Text: 1 John 2:1-6

- 1. John suggests that Christians aspire to live apart from sin. Is that an out-of-date notion, or something we should still pursue?
- 2. We have all seen movies in which someone charged with a crime is reluctant to tell their defense attorney the truth. Why might that be? Do you have that reluctance toward Jesus?
- 3. Review the elements applied to us through our Advocate (propitiation, forgiveness, cleansing). How do those impact you personally?
- 4. If a person is unclear about sin (what it is and what things are sin), how likely are they to benefit from the Advocate? Why does that matter?
- 5. Does every Christian "abide" in Christ? Do we all abide to the same degree? What makes the difference?
- 6. What are some ways you have encountered the work of the "accuser of the brethren"? How does abiding in the Advocate help with that?
- 7. How is your life changed after a conversation with the Advocate?
