- 3. When you consider the two types of responses in Matt 5:38-48, what percentage of Christians do you think are prepared to respond in a Christ-like manner? How does Matt 24:12 impact your perception?
- 4. Describe an action you thought would be simple, and then you realized you needed practice (like a 14 year-old thinking driving would be simple...). Do you think you have sufficient <u>practice</u> responding to hostility like Jesus that you can respond in love in every circumstance?
- 5. If our culture continues to "drive Christians back into their homes and churches" how will that affect you? How will it affect Refuge Church? How will it affect America?
- 6. If all tax benefits for charitable contributions were eliminated, how would it affect your giving? How do you think it would affect churches in general?

Principles of those with Christianophobia:

- 1. They prefer measures that may... disproportionately hurt Christians but are not obvious in their intent to do harm. [taxing churches: it's just being fair to nonreligious people]. p, 40
- 2. Religious Neutrality: limit Christian interference in order to accomplish religious neutrality. [keep religious beliefs out of the public arena. "... drive Christians back into their homes and churches." e.g. Wheaton College, Chik Fil A, ACA] p, 40
- 3. They fear the loss of their rights of Christianity is allowed to flourish. [Vanderbily Univ., Bowdoin College policies: all student organizations are forbidden to have religious requirements for leadership.] p, 45
