BIBLE READING INSIGHTS

As we enter the last week of April, we begin the book of Judges on our annual reading plan. If there is a book more appropriate to our current age, I don't know what it is. Judges 21:25 "In those days, there was no king in Israel. Everyone did what was right in their own eyes." Such a sad testimony to the realities of their season. . . and of ours. The greatest challenge facing us, and our future is an epistemological one: What is truth? Just last week, the CEO of a national news organization declared truth wasn't a verifiable subject because there are "so many truths." Such nonsense is the essence of Judges 21:25. The clear truth is that there IS truth, as painful and inconvenient as it may be. Jesus IS the truth! As such, He has established some realities – gravity for example. I notice no one wants to declare themselves free from that truth. If they did, they would be - and should be - mocked for their lunacy. Some of what we're seeing today is no less ludicrous. I beg of you - make sure you spend time with the Lord and His word regularly to ensure you don't get fooled by someone selling their version of their "truth." Remember: Satan is the deceiver and can disguise himself. Make sure you hold firm to Jesus, the one and only truth.


