





This is the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ.

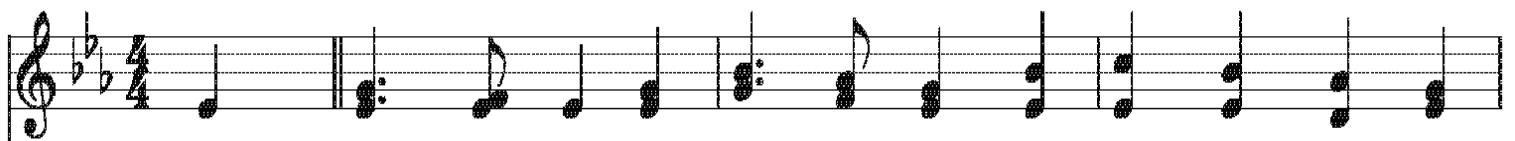

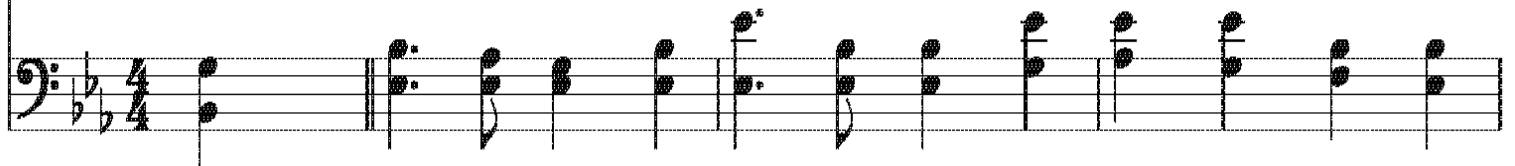

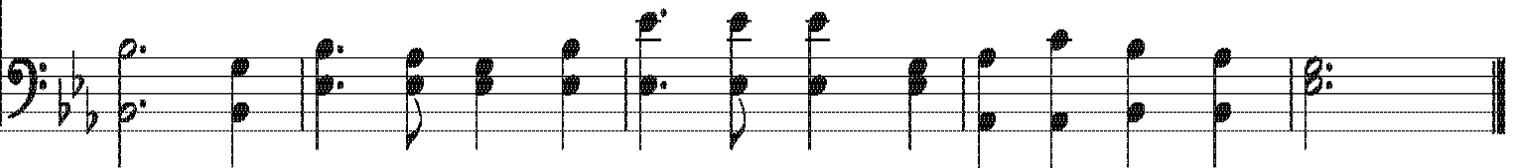
