### **Ministry Experience**

Ken has served in a wide range of ministry roles over the past three decades. Most recently as an Assistant Professor of Business at Warner University, where he taught leadership and management courses, led student discipleship groups, and spoke in chapel services. Prior to this, he served as Senior Pastor at Mountainview Christian Church in Colorado from 2009 to 2022, where he revitalized the church following a leadership transition, led a successful \$1.6 million capital campaign, mentored younger pastors, and helped start five new churches. His earlier ministry roles include founding and leading LifePoint Christian Church in San Diego, as well as serving in senior leadership positions in churches in Georgia and California. Ken also brings church planting experience through his work with Church Planters of the Rockies and as a coach to new church leaders. Additionally, he served as the founding Vice Chairman of Bridge of Hope Greater Denver, a nonprofit supporting single mothers through housing and mentoring. Throughout his ministry, Ken has demonstrated a passion for leadership development, church health, and Gospel-centered growth.

# In Ken's Words

### MINISTRY & CALLING

# Q: Can you briefly share your journey into pastoral ministry?

A: My parents loved Jesus and His Church, and they taught me to do the same. While in high school, God stirred a desire within me to serve His Church. This desire was affirmed by our pastor, and he encouraged me to pursue it. He was the first adult outside of my parents who said he saw leadership potential in me.

### Q: What do you love most about being a pastor?

A: I love being able to engage a wide spectrum of people with the message of Jesus. I enjoy the challenge of connecting with skeptics, searchers, and seasoned believers during the same sermon. I love seeing Jesus captivate people and then watching how their lives are transformed by His grace.

# Q: What drew you to Calvary Church and this opportunity?

A: There are many factors that attracted us to Calvary Church. I love the sense of rootedness that exists at Calvary and quickly noticed how much people care about their church. I love that Calvary is surrounded by colleges and universities. I've seen firsthand the spiritual awakening that is happening among young adults and believe Calvary is well positioned to play a key role in that.

# Q: How would you describe your preaching style and approach to teaching the Bible?

A: My approach to preaching is text-based and Christ-centered. My goal is to help people properly understand the passage within its context and how it applies to them. Ultimately, my purpose in preaching is to point people to Jesus. For pre-Christians, I want them to feel safe exploring matters of faith, having questions, and feeling like their concerns are recognized. For Christians, I want them to have a growing confidence in who Jesus is and how their faith impacts every aspect of life.

### Q: What is your vision for the local church in this cultural moment?

A: In every generation, the church has had challenges and opportunities. While there is no conflict between grace and truth, there is often tension. In this moment, I believe we need a church that is committed to knowing and following Jesus. A healthy, thriving church is one that readily accepts the responsibility of being salt and light in its culture – even when it is difficult.



### **HEART & VALUES**

### Q: What values or convictions are most important to you in ministry?

A: Because He is the Son of God, I believe Jesus is the smartest and wisest person who ever lived. I try to live by His values and convictions. In leading teams, I value honesty, hard work, and having fun together. Whether it's a staff person or a church member, I love helping people grow in their own giftedness and calling.

### Q: Who has shaped your leadership the most?

A: My earliest example of servant leadership was my father. He was quiet and calm, and served our church behind the scenes. Other influential people would be the writings of Ken Blanchard, Jim Collins, Patrick Lencioni, Jim Cymbala, and Brené Brown.

### Q: How do you stay grounded spiritually and emotionally as a leader?

A: I wholeheartedly believe in the principles of Emotionally Healthy Spirituality and Emotionally Healthy Leadership by Peter Scazzero. The principles I practice include regular time with God in reading His Word and prayer, times of silence and solitude, and surrounding myself with godly people who will speak into my life.

### Q: What's one thing people might be surprised to learn about you?

A: I was a competitive roller speed skater until I started middle school. And we once met Pat Boone at his house in Beverly Hills.

### Q: What are your favorite books, podcasts, or hobbies right now?

A: Outside of the Bible, my favorite books would be *The Anxious Generation* by Jonathan Haidt, *Spirit of the Disciplines* by Dallas Willard, and *Atomic Habits* by James Clear. For hobbies, I enjoy writing and we both have been learning Spanish through Duolingo.


