

## **Exact Sciences Sustainability**

Ever wonder if large businesses in Wisconsin such as Exact Sciences are "green-motivated?" I have many times as I often drive by their huge campus. Here is a truly remarkable green example.

Exact Sciences operates six labs in three different states and a few more around the world, so their Metrology department handles a lot of equipment, says Exact Sciences Metrologist Brian Guggenheim. Sometimes the equipment is retired but still in good working condition. There are many hoops to jump when donating lab equipment, but the Exact Sciences Metrology team jumped the hoops which resulted in a classroom in Wisconsin -- Oregon High School Lab of Biology and Biotechnology to receive some retired, but still useful equipment. This donation provides hands-on experience for the students and the no-longer-needed equipment found a home – not a landfill.
